18 He that believeth on him is not 6 condemned: but he that p,qbelieveth not 7 is condemned already, because he hath not believed in the 'name of the only begotten "Son of God.

19 And this is the 8,8 condemnation, that t, ulight is come into the world, and men v,wloved x, ydarkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil.

20 For every one that ^pdoeth ^zevil ^whateth the ^ulight, neither cometh to the light, lest his deeds should be reproved.

21 But he that a, b doeth ctruth cometh to the light, that his deeds may be made manifest, that they are wrought in God.

22 ¶ After these things came Jē'sus and his 'disciples into the land of 'Jū-dæ'a; and there he tarried with them, and baptized.

23 And ^hJöhn also was ⁱbaptizing in Æ'non near to Sā'lim, because there was much water there: and they came, and were baptized.

6 Now ^kJā'cob's ^mwell was there. Jē'sus therefore, being "wearied with his journey, sat thus on the well: and it was about the sixth hour.

7 There cometh a woman of ^hSā-mā'rĭ-a to draw water: Jē'sus saith unto her, Give me to drink.

8 (For his disciples were gone away unto the city to buy meat.) and word bus

9 Then saith the woman of hSā-mā'rĭ-a unto him, How is it that thou, being a 'Jew, askest drink of me, which am a woman of Sā-mā'rĭ-a? for the Jews phave no dealings with the Sā-măr'ĭ-tang.

10 Jē'sus answered and said unto her, q, TIf thou knewest the ⁸gift of God, and who it is that saith to thee, Give me to drink; thou wouldest have asked of him, and the would have given thee living "water.

11 The woman saith unto him, Sir, thou hast nothing to draw with, and the well is deep: from whence then hast thou that living "water?

12 Art thou greater than our father kJā'cob, which gave us the mwell, and drank thereof himself, and his children, and his cattle?

13 Je'sus answered and said unto her, Whosoever drinketh of this water shall thirst again:

14 But vwhosoever drinketh of the "water that I shall give him shall never *, wthirst: but *the water that ⁸I shall give him shall be in him a well of water springing up into yeverlasting elife.

33 Therefore said the ^qdisciples one to another, Hath any man brought him ought to eat?

34 Je'sus saith unto them, v, w My meat is to x, y do the zwill of a him that sent me, and to finish his work.

35 Say not ye, bThere are yet four months, and then cometh harvest? behold, I say unto you, Lift up your eyes, and look on the fields; for they are white already to charvest.

36 And dhe that reapeth receiveth wages, and gathereth fruit unto elife eternal: that both he that soweth and he that reapeth may rejoice together.

37 And herein is that saying true, One soweth, and another reapeth.

38 I sent you to reap that whereon ye bestowed no labour: other men laboured, and ye are entered into their labours.

39 ¶ And many of the Sā-măr'-I-tang of that city believed on him for the saying of the woman, which htestified, He told me all that ever I did.

40 So when the Sā-mar'ī-tans were come unto him, they ibesought him that he would tarry with them: and he abode there two days.

7 The impotent man answered him, Sir, I have no man, when the water is troubled, to put me into the epool: but while I am coming, another steppeth down before me.

8 Jē'sus saith unto him, Rise, take up thy bed, and walk.

9 And immediately the man was made 1, m whole, and took up his bed, and walked: and on the same day was the ⁿsabbath.

rsabbath day. Others said, How can a man that is a sinner do such 3,0 miracles? And there was a division among them.

17 They say unto the blind man again, What sayest thou of him, that he hath opened thine eyes? He t, usaid, He is a prophet.

18 But the Jews did not believe concerning him, that he had been blind, and received his sight, until they called the parents of him that had received his sight.

19 And they asked them, saying, Is this your son, who ye say was born blind? how then doth he now see?

20 His parents answered them and said, We know that this is our son, and that he was born blind:

21 But by what means he now seeth, we know not; or who hath opened his eyes, we know not: he is of age; ask him: he shall speak for himself.

22 These words spake his parents, because they "feared the *Jews: for the Jews had agreed already, that if any man did yconfess that he was Christ, he should be z,a,bput out of the csynagogue.

23 Therefore said his parents, He is of age; ask him.

24 Then again called they the man that was ablind, and esaid unto him, Give God the praise: we know that this man is a sin-

25 He answered and said. Whether he be a sinner or no, I know not: one thing I know, that, whereas I was dblind, now I see.

26 Then said they to him again, What did he to thee? how opened he thine eyes?

27 He answered them, I have told you already, and ye did not we blind also?

hear: wherefore would ye hear it again? will ve also be his disciples?

28 Then they reviled him, and said, Thou art his [†]disciple; but g, h we are 'Mō'ses' disciples.

29 We know that God ispake

unto Mō'ses: as for this 4fellow, we know not from whence he is. 30 The man answered and said unto them. Why herein is a marvellous thing, that ye know not from whence he is, and yet he hath opened mine eyes.

31 Now we know that God heareth not sinners: but if any mman be a worshipper of God. and "doeth his will, him "he heareth.

32 Since the world began was it not heard that any man opened the eyes of one that was born dblind.

33 If this man were not of God. he could do nothing.

34 They answered and said unto him, Thou wast altogether born in sins, and gdost thou teach us? And they a, b cast him out.

35 ¶ Jē'sus heard that they had cast him out; and when he had found him, he said unto him, Dost thou believe on the ^pSon of God?

36 He answered and said, Who is he, Lord, that I might believe on him?

37 And Jē'sus said unto him, Thou hast both seen him, and it is he that talketh with thee.

38 And he said, Lord, I qbelieve. And he 'worshipped him. 39 ¶ And Jē'sus said, For judgment I am come into this world, that they which kee not might see; and that they which 'see might be made blind.

5 Then came Je'sus forth, wearing the herown of ithorns, and the 'purple robe. And ${}^bPi'$ late saith unto them, Behold the man!

6 When the chief opriests therefore and officers saw him, they pcried out, saying, q,rCrucify him, crucify him. Pī'late saith unto them, 'Take ye him, and crucify him: for I find no fault in him.

7 The Jews answered him, We have a law, and by our law he ought to die, because "he made himself the Son of God.

8 \ When Pi'late therefore

heard that psaying, he was the more afraid;

9 And went again into the vjudgment hall, and asaith unto Jē'sus, Whence art thou? But ^wJē'sus ^xgave him no answer.

10 aThen saith Pī'late unto him, Speakest thou not unto me? knowest thou not that I have power to crucify thee, and have power to release thee?

18 Where they icrucified him, and two other with him, on either side one, and Je'sus in the midst.

19 ¶ And ^bPī'late wrote a title, and put it on the *cross. And the writing was, JE'SUS OF NĂZ'A-RĔTH THE KING OF THE JEWS.

20 This title then read many of the Jews: for the place where Jē'sus was 'crucified was nigh to the "city: and it was written in "Hē'brew, and "Greek, and vLăt'in.

21 Then said the chief kpriests of the Jews to Pī'late, Write not, The King of the Jews; but that he said, I am King of the Jews.

22 Pī'late wanswered, What I have written I have written.

23 ¶ Then the *soldiers, when they had crucified Jē'sus, took his garments, and made four parts, to every soldier a part; and also his coat: now the coat was without seam, woven from the top throughout.

24 They said therefore among themselves, Let us not rend it, but cast ylots for it, whose it shall be: that the z,ascripture might be fulfilled, which saith, bThey parted my raiment among them, and for my vesture they did cast lots. These things therefore the soldiers did.

25 ¶ Now there stood by the *cross of Jē'sus his c,dmother. and his mother's sister, 'Mā'ry the wife of Cle'o-phas, and /Mā'ry Măg-da-lē'nė.

26 When Jē'sus therefore saw his c,d mother, and the disciple standing by, whom he hloved, he saith unto his mother, Woman, behold thy son!

27 Then saith he to the ^gdisciple, Behold thy 'mother! And from that hour that disciple itook dher unto his own home.

28 ¶ After this, Jē'sus knowing that all ithings were now accomplished, that the kscripture might be fulfilled, saith, I thirst.

29 Now there was set a vessel full of ^lvinegar: and they filled a mspunge with vinegar, and put it upon hyssop, and put it to his mouth.

30 When Jē'sus therefore had received the 'vinegar, he said, 'It is finished: and he bowed his head, and ^pgave up ³the ghost.

31 The Jews therefore, because it was the qpreparation, that the bodies should not remain upon the cross on the sabbath day, (for that sabbath day was an high day,) besought 'Pī'late that their legs might be broken, and that they might be taken away.

32 Then came the "soldiers, and brake the legs of the first, and of the other which was crucified with him.

33 But when they came to Jē'sus, and saw that he was dead already, they brake not his legs: 34 But one of the "soldiers with a vspear pierced his side, and forthwith came there out

wblood and water. 35 And he that saw it bare yrecord, and his record is true: and he knoweth that he x, y saith true, that ve might believe.

36 For these things were done, that the kscripture should be fulfilled, ^zA ^abone of him shall not be broken.

37 And again another bscripture saith, cThey shall look on him whom they pierced.

38 ¶ And after this †Jō'seph of [‡]Ăr-ĭ-mă-thæ'a, being a ^ddisciple of Je'sus, but secretly for efear of the Jews, besought Pi'-

late that he might take away the body of Jē'sus: and Pī'late gave him leave. He came therefore, and took the body of Jē'sus.

39 And hthere came also Nic-ode'mus, which at the first came to Jē'sus by night, and brought a mixture of ^jmyrrh and ^kaloes, about an hundred pound weight. 40 Then took they the body of Jē'sus, and wound it in linen

clothes with the 'spices, as the manner of the Jews is to "bury. 41 Now in the place where he was crucified there was a ⁿgar-

den; and in the garden a new

sepulchre, wherein was never man yet laid.

42 There olaid they Je'sus therefore because of the Jews' ^ppreparation day; for the ⁿsepulchre was nigh at hand.

af HE bfirst day of the week cometh d. eMā'ry Măg-dalē'nē early, when it was yet dark, unto the sepulchre, and seeth the stone taken away from the sepulchre.

2 Then she runneth, and cometh to Sī'mon Pē'tēr, and to the gother disciple, whom Jē'sus hloved, and saith unto them, They have taken away the Lord out of the sepulchre, and we know not where they have laid him.

3 Pē'tēr therefore went forth, and that gother disciple, and came to the sepulchre.

4 So they ran both together: and the gother disciple did outrun Pē'tēr, and came first to the sepulchre.

5 And he stooping down, and looking in, saw the ilinen clothes lying; yet went he not in.

6 Then cometh Sī'mon 'Pē'tēr following him, and went into the sepulchre, and seeth the ilinen clothes lie.

7 And the napkin, that was about his head, not lying with the linen clothes, but wrapped together in a place by itself.

8 Then went in also that gother disciple, which came first to the sepulchre, and he saw, and believed.

9 For as yet they knew not the scripture, that he must 'rise again from the dead.

10 Then the "disciples went away again unto their own home.

11 ¶ But dMā'ry stood without at the sepulchre c,n,oweeping: and as she wept, she stooped down, and looked into the sepulchre.

12 And seeth two pangels in white sitting, the one at the head, and the other at the feet, where the body of Jē'sus had lain.

13 And they say unto her, Woman, why weepest thou? She saith unto them, ^qBecause they have taken away my Lord, and I know not where they have laid him.

14 And when dshe had thus said, 'she turned herself back, and saw Je'sus standing, and knew not that it was Jē'sus.

15 Jē'sus saith unto her, Woman, why weepest thou? whom seekest thou? She, supposing him to be the gardener, saith unto him, Sir, if thou have borne him hence, tell me where thou hast laid him, and I will take him away.

19 Then the same day at evening, being the yfirst day of the week, when the doors were shut where the "disciples were assembled for fear of the Jews, *came Jē'sus and stood in the midst, and saith unto them, ^{z,a}Peace be unto you.

20 And when he had so said, he shewed unto them his hands and his side. Then were the bdisciples glad, when they saw the Lord.

21 Then said Jē'sus to them again, a,cPeace be unto you: as my dFather hath esent me, even so send I you.

22 And when he had said this, he breathed on them, and saith unto them, Receive ye the 9Holy Ghost:

23 h,iWhose soever sins ye remit, they are remitted unto them; and whose soever sins ve retain, they are retained.

24 ¶ But ^kThŏm'as, one of the btwelve, called Did'y-mus, was not with them when Jē'sus came. 25 The other bdisciples therefore said unto him, We have seen the Lord. But he 'said unto them, Except I shall see in his hands the print of the nails, and put my finger into the print of the nails, and thrust my hand into his side, I will not believe. 26 ¶ And after eight days again his bdisciples were within. and "Thom'as with them: then mcame Jē'sus, the doors being shut, and stood in the midst, and said, a, Peace be unto you.

30 ¶ And many other signs truly did Jē'sus in the presence of his bdisciples, which are not written in this book:

31 But these are written, that ye might believe that Jē'sus is the "Christ, the 'Son of God; and that vbelieving ye might have wlife *through his *name.

CHAPTER 21

Jesus appears to the disciples at the sea of Tiberias. 6 The great draught of fishes. 15 He tries Peter's love; 18 signifies by what death he should die; 20 and rebukes his curiosity concerning John. conclusion.

FTER these things Je'sus bshewed himself again to the disciples at the sea of Tibe'ri-as; and on this wise shewed he himself.

9 As soon then as they were come to land, they saw a fire of coals there, and ⁿfish laid thereon, and ^qbread.

10 Jē'şus saith unto them, Bring of the ⁿfish which ye have now caught.

11 Sī'mon 'Pē'tēr went up, and drew the 'net to land full of great fishes, an hundred and fifty and three: and for all there were so many, yet was not the net broken.

12 Jē'ṣus saith unto them, Come and dine. And none of the 'disciples durst ask him, Who art thou? knowing that it was the Lord.

13 Jē'ṣus then cometh, and taketh ^qbread, and giveth them, and ⁿfish likewise.

18 Verily, verily, I say unto thee, When thou wast young, thou girdedst thyself, and walkedst whither thou wouldest: but when thou shalt be old, ²thou shalt stretch forth thy hands, and another shall gird thee, and carry thee whither thou wouldest not.

19 This spake he, signifying by what ^adeath he should ^{b, c}glorify God. And when he had spoken this, he saith unto him, Follow me.

20 Then ^dPē'tēr, turning about, seeth the ^edisciple whom Jē'-sus ^floved following; which also leaned on his breast at supper, and said, Lord, which is he that betrayeth thee?

21 ^dPē'tēr seeing him saith to Jē'ṣus, Lord, and what shall this man do?

22 Jē'ṣus saith unto him, If I will that he tarry till I gcome, what is that to thee? follow thou me.

23 Then went this saying abroad among the brethren, that 'that disciple should not die: yet Jē'ṣus said not unto him, He shall not die; but, If I will that he tarry till I come, what is that to thee?

24 "This is the disciple which h,itestifieth of these things, and wrote these things: and we know that his testimony is true.
